"Cathook" Framing Tool  
Nail puller/spud wrench, 10" long

Performs over 20 framing and construction procedures that no other tool on the market today will do. A small, all in one tool, wt 1#, instead of a 4# adjustable spud wrench, 1# nail puller and a 6# board straightener.



Moving a crowned plate, deck board, twisted floor joist, align ceiling joist to a mark is easy for the "Cathook".



Using the Spud handle/hook to align a red iron bolt hole, and also serves as a bull pin or a drive pin.



Using the 1/2" socket drive to tighten nuts or hold bolt heads, handy for deck bolts or a mechanic's tool



Using the head as a tack hammer

The "Cathook" has a dozen or more things it will do, such as pulling staples, separating lumber and many more. Made out of 7020 steel, it weighs one pound, made with titanium 10oz. Nail extractor claws have an extra deep oval well forged into them to shed the wood from the extraction. Unlike regular nail pullers with no hammer head/socket driver "Cathook" can easily be carried in the leather add-on tool holders.
